Sun., March 12, 8:26 a.m. (moonrise) - 10a.m. This moon is named for the worm castings that are visible once the ground thaws in our colder climes. Join naturalist Brian Swanson for a look at some of Carmel Mtn. Preserves rare vernal pools, bustling with life after life-giving winter rains. Expect to see spadefoot tadpoles, frog tadpoles, vernal pool specialized plants, and possibly fairy shrimp. We'll also look for a variety of colorful wildflowers in the chaparral habitat. Meet at moonrise (8:26AM) on the west edge of Ocean Air Park, located on Fairport Way. Rain at time of hike cancels.
